HOLDING ON TO OUR HOPE THROUGH MARY

Catholics from throughout the diocese gathered for our annual Assumption Pilgrimage.

As usual, we began with Rosary before the clergy processed onto the outdoor altar for Mass beneath our recently erected canopy.

In his homily, Bishop Terry said Pope Francis highlighted Mary's constant presence, encouraging young people especially to hold on to this hope as an antidote to despair.

"In the Gospel, we heard the Song of Mary, the Magnificat: it is the song of hope, it is the song of the People of God walking through history," Bishop Terry said.

"It is the song many saints, men and women, some famous, and very many others unknown to us but known to God: mothers and fathers, catechists, missionaries, priests, sisters, young people, even children and grandparents: these have faced the struggle of life while carrying in their heart the hope of the little and the humble.

"Mary says: 'My souls glorifies the Lord' – today, the Church too sings this in every part of the world. This song is particularly strong in places where the Body of Christ is suffering the Passion. For us Christians, wherever the Cross is, there is hope, always. If there is no hope, we are not Christian.

"Let us turn to Our Lady and implore the grace to rejoice in the freedom of the children of God, to use that freedom wisely in the service of our brothers and sisters, and to live and work as signs of the hope which will find its fulfilment in that eternal kingdom where to reign is to serve. Amen."

Pilgrims pray and walk come rain, come shine



Thirty-three people took part in the second walking pilgrimage from York Oratory to Osmotherley.

The pilgrims began with Mass at 6am on Friday before joining the Foss Path to walk through the Vale of York and on to Farlington, where they prayed in St Leonard's Church.

They group arrived at Ampleforth Abbey for Vespers, supper, Compline and sleep and after Mass on Saturday, set forth for Rievaulx, where they were joined by some younger parishioners.

They continued singing and praying through driving rain and stopped at All Saints, Old Byland, for hymns and prayers before arriving at the Lady Chapel at six o'clock, wet but grateful.

The pilgrimage concluded with dinner at the Queen Catherine, the only inn in England named after Queen Catherine of Aragon, who was a patroness of the Lady Chapel.

The Lady Chapel's year in numbers...

- More than 1,600 schoolchildren attended organised pilgrimages, as well as 300 people in parish and other groups. Many more made individual or family visits, including walkers on the Cleveland Way.
- 35 schools and parishes from the Diocese of Middlesbrough, the Diocese of Leeds and the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle visited and there was also one wedding.
- There have been 491 contactless donations over the past 12 months using the card machine at the Lady Chapel, mostly small and almost half gift aided. We are working to try to get the service improved.

A Vigil Mass is celebrated every Saturday at 3pm - the first Mass in our diocese each weekend.

A priest may be available after Mass for anyone wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
